Newly Enhanced Security Wall Nears Completion






The new security wall around Casa is nearing completion. What remains is to add the new front entry gate, which is taller and more secure, a taller back gate leading to the house in the back field with added security features, and two non-see-through gates leading the open the fields where the cattle graze and farming takes place.

We will be painting a portion of the entry wall Casa Peach, while the rest will remain the cinderblock pattern. We also have plans to paint a mural, showing waves of various colors and the silhouettes of children, on the wall as you enter Casa. We want that mural to reflect the love and care that the children are receiving within our walls.
