


Vocational Education Facility update

In keeping with exposing our children to new experiences as a means of kindling area of interest and possibly a lifelong pursuit, we are excited with the progress being made with the vocational education (VE) facility. The VE facility will provide exposure and experience for our children in wood working, construction, welding, principles of plumbing and electricity, and auto mechanics to name a few. We have learned that local instructors, experts in their field, can be hired to conduct class es in their respective areas of expertise. This approach is relatively inexpensive running about \$200 US for a two-week program. The class schedule provides three-four-hour classes per week, once a month. This approach will also ensure that the instruction reflects the most current advancements made in each of the trades. The final stage of construction yet to be completed on the VE building includes installing sheetrock, texture and painting the walls.

We strive to provide our children with opportunities to learn and develop life skills paving the way for a career, a livelihood and pursuit of a passion. That might mean a university or trade school education, which ever best suits them.

In addition, the VE center will serve as a place where classes in the trades can be held for high school youth in the community who want to learn practical skills. Our underling goal is for this service to be a forum to develop relations with the youth in the community and teach God's word. We are confident that this project will have a positive impact on the lives of children at large, and we are excited to plant the seed and how God gives growth and in the coming months.





We are excited to share the latest developments in our construction project at the Church building. The second floor is near the final stages of construction, the installation of doors, trim, texture on the walls and the first coat of paint have all been completed. This space has been designed with the purpose of serving as a school where future Bible students and members of our community can learn and grow together in their faith.

Work has also begun on the third floor by planning living quarter for four male students, all with the aim of providing students with a comfortable and welcoming place where they can live and study during their two-year program. We want to thank all those who have contributed to this project, be it through donations, volunteer work and prayers. Students with families will find living accommodations in our three on site duplexes. Your help has been instrumental in making this project a goal and dream come true.





We recently hosted an activity at the Church building that allowed our church family to help those less fortunate in our community. With the participation of our members, visitors, and baptized youth at Casa, we were able to distribute 1,760 lbs. of food among 200 people in need.

During the activity, the Bible Students took the contact information of the recipients for follow up and possible bible studies. We are committed to providing long-term help and support to our community, and this includes connecting with the people contacted in this activity.


By taking the contact details of the attendees, we can inform them about future activities in the church, provide support and assistance at any time and establish meaningful relationships with them.
